An RRVC 'Holiday in Company'

An Overview of our 'Holiday In Company'

Originally, this Holiday was planned to go to the South Australian Eyre and Yorke Peninsulas but, due to requests from members to see the West Australian Wildflowers, the original 'Holiday' has been expanded.

There is NO Support Crew. This 'Holiday in Company' requires attendees to get themselves to and from the various accommodation sites. It is strongly recommended you discuss your travel with other attending members and decide on whether to use the 'Indicative Itinerary' or make other arrangements.

Power and water accommodation has been organised for every formal stopover in SA & WA.

The accommodation will be a minimum of 3 nights at a couple of locations but the majority of stopovers will be for four (4) or five (5) days. This will ensure you have a more relaxed and leisurely 'Holiday'.

Registrations & Attending Numbers

It is expected this 'Holiday' will be very popular so organisers will plan as follows

Step 1:

Expressions of interest open until **1 July 2025**

Step 2:

Organisers advise cost details for the Holiday and call for formal registrations with rig fee and first night accommodation. These will be accepted in order of receipt of payment and payment must be received during the period **2 July 2025 to 1 Aug 25.**

Step 3:

Two Scheduled Payments will be organised for payment of accommodation fees at organised parks. (Not Indicative Itinerary journey locations).

Accommodation Fees

In 2022, van parks are requesting 50% deposit for bulk bookings. This may or may not change but the club is working on the 50% requirement as 'worst case scenario'.

Tours and events

No tours or events are being organised so this will be your responsibility. Tour company information is provided in this publication.

Indicative Itinerary

The itinerary is available on the 'Holiday' webpage. The trip down to South Australia is independent or group travel and you can use the itinerary or develop your own. The important thing is you arrive at the caravan park sites on the day booked.

Yorke Peninsula

The first 'Holiday' location is Edithburgh at the lower end of the Peninsula. This location was selected as it provides all amenities, shops etc as well as being located on the waterfront. From this location you can base and do daily tours around the entire Peninsula.

Eyre Peninsula

Basing at Port Lincoln and Venus Bay, you will be able to tour the entire Peninsula and do fishing trips and daily tours of the local area. Special note is the availability of fresh oysters.

Dalwallinu & Mullewa

Stopping a few days in each location so you can tour the 'wildflower way'

Cervantes

Stopping here so you can visit the Pinnacle Desert and Lake Thetis, the saline lake sheltering oldest marine fossils in the world.

Perth

The Holiday will stop at Perth for a period of relaxation. Nothing planned so you can visit friends, shop or tour.

South of Perth

Various locations designed to exploit the viewing of wildflowers and general touring of this region.

At *Esperance* members will arrive the day before the street parade and wildflower festival.

General Information

This 'Holiday' does not have a support crew so attending members need to make the 'Holiday In Company' by themselves or in the company of other members.

It is recommended small groups of 3 to 5 rigs accompany each other on this Holiday.

An *indicative itinerary* has been organised for members to either utilise or make their own way with others to the various accommodation locations.

We have minimized driving hours to an average **266** klms per driving day, however, remote distances along the route require a couple of days of over 300 klms. This average does not include touring in your vehicle.

Happy Hour.

When at accommodation centres, Happy Hour will take place on a casual basis so people don't feel compelled to head back from their days outing. When travelling 'in company' you can have happy hour every afternoon if you so wish.

What Roads do we travel?

The 'Holiday In Company' Indicative Itinerary roads are bitumen. When touring the regions, or traveling your own way to and around SA & WA you may find dirt roads.

What type of rig can I take

This 'Holiday In Company' is classified as "**All Rigs**". You can bring your caravan, camper trailer, 5th wheeler, camper van or motorhome.

Outback Etiquette

Participants need to maintain a distance of approx. 400 meters between rigs. Please stop along the way for rest and sightseeing.

Please work with heavy vehicles via UHF radio to ensure they are able to pass you. They are working, we are holidaying.

Onboard Water (Additional Reserve)

When you leave home you need to consider having extra water onboard, preferably in 2 litre containers (in case one breaks).

Emergency services advise we work on 10 litres per day per person.

Additional Fuel

You need to consider having extra fuel onboard. The amount of fuel required is your responsibility and needs to be sufficient to get you to the next available fuel stop.

Travelling across the Nullarbor you should consider stopping at each Roadhouse (approx. 250 klms apart) as power outages and malfunctions occur.

Also have sufficient cash in your pocket to pay for fuel in case EFTPOS is not working.

UHF Radio

ALL participants must have a working UHF radio in their vehicle suitable for contacting vehicles within a 3 km radius and be able to talk to someone who is below the crest of the road.

A high range flexible aerial is recommended to ensure the aerial does not break away from the vehicle from vibrations.

Driving Hours

Due to the high risk of goat, kangaroo, cattle, camel and emu hits, driving hours should be restricted to 8am to 4pm.

Wind Day

When travelling across the Nullarbor you often experience a headwind. This wind can double your fuel consumption.

Personal Responsibility

Participants are responsible for All Costs, including (not exhaustive list):

- Vehicle, motorhome, caravan, campervan & tent hire and costs,
- Travel and personal Insurances,
- Having a first aid kit in your vehicle
- Breakdowns, roadworthiness of vehicle/rig, repairs and police fines,
- Medications (enough physical stock for entire journey and any unexpected delays),
- Breakfasts, lunches, snacks, morning teas, drinks, dinner where not provided,
- Tours & events of choice and meals of choice.
- Cancellation fees

Quarantine Areas

Participants need to be familiar with State Quarantine Regulations.

The loss of food and/or penalty is a personal responsibility.

Specific 'Holiday' Information

Accommodation Bookings

The Event Coordinator will contact each accommodation site a year or so prior to the start date to gain pricing and other details.

Final pricing will be advertised to those attending and placed on the Website.

Expressions of Interest can be registered anytime up to the advertised cut off date.

Formal registration will not take place until pricing advised.

Once advised, those wishing to attend will need to

1. register and pay the non-refundable rig fee and 50% **of the accommodation fee.
2. Pay 2 additional scheduled payments during the year
3. Formal Registrations will be accepted in order of payment receipt up to the total number of rigs allocated to this event.
4. A waiting list will then operate

*** 2023 Accommodation sites now requesting 50% deposit and remainder of fee paid a month out from travel. 2023 prices indicate the 50% deposit will be approximately \$1300*



Arriving at Accommodation Site

No responsibility will be accepted by the Event Coordinator or Club Committee for your failing to arrive at an accommodation site.

If this occurs you will need to make contact with Park management to seek a refund or credit.

Tours, Events and Dining

WILDFLOWER WAY

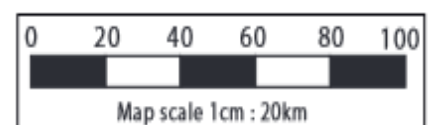
